From G4154; a current of air, that is, breath (blast) or a breeze; by analogy or figuratively a spirit, that is, (human) the rational soul, (by implication) vita/ principle, mental disposition, etc., or (superhuman) an angel, daemon, or (divine) God, Christ's spirit, the Holy spirit: - ghost, life, spirit (-ual, -ually), mind. Compare G5590.

(THAYER)

Thayer Definition:

- 1) the third person of the triune God, the Holy Spirit, coequal, coeternal with the Father and the Son
  - 1a) sometimes referred to in a way which emphasises his personality and character (the \\Holy\\ Spirit)
  - 1b) sometimes referred to in a way which emphasises his work and power (the Spirit of \\Truth\\)
  - 1c) never referred to as a depersonalised force
- 2) the spirit, i.e. the vital principal by which the body is animated
  - 2a) the rational spirit, the power by which the human being feels, thinks, decides
  - 2b) the soul
- 3) a spirit, i.e. a simple essence, devoid of all or at least all grosser matter, and possessed of the power of knowing,

desiring, deciding, and acting

3a) a life giving spirit

3b) a human soul that has left the body

3c) a spirit higher than man but lower than God, i.e. an angel

3c1) used of demons, or evil spirits, who were conceived as inhabiting the bodies of men

3c2) the spiritual nature of Christ, higher than the highest angels and equal to God, the divine nature of Christ

4) the disposition or influence which fills and governs the soul of any one

4a) the efficient source of any power, affection, emotion, desire, etc.

5) a movement of air (a gentle blast)

5a) of the wind, hence the wind itself

5b) breath of nostrils or mouth

A form of H3824; the heart; also used (figuratively) very widely for the feelings, the will and even the intellect; likewise for the centre of anything: + care for, comfortably, consent, X considered, courage [-eous], friend [-ly], ([broken-], [hard-], [merry-], [stiff-], [stout-], double) heart (I-ed)), X heed, X I, kindly, midst, mind (ed), X regard (I-ed)), X themselves, X unawares, understanding, X well, willingly, wisdom.

**(STRONG)**

Prolonged from a primary Kâp kar (Latin cor, "heart"); the heart, that is, (figuratively) the thoughts or feelings (mind); also (by analogy) the middle: - (+ broken-) heart (-ed).

**(THAYER)**

**1) the heart**

**1a) that organ in the animal body which is the centre of the circulation of the blood, and hence was regarded as the seat of physical life**

**1b) denotes the centre of all physical and spiritual life**

**2a) the vigour and sense of physical life**
